Please note that the pre-requisites for applying to the program have changed to the following:

- English Composition, ENG1010 (formerly-ENG*101), completed with a grade of C or higher
- Anatomy & Physiology I, BIO2111 (formerly-BIO*211), completed with a grade of C or higher within 5 years of application deadline (February 1, 2025, which means A&P I taken **before** Fall 2019 is not accepted).
- Anatomy & Physiology II, BIO2112 (formerly- BIO*212) completed with a grade of C or higher within 5 years of application deadline (February 1, 2025, which means A&P II taken **before** fall 2019 is not accepted). **Note:** the student can apply to the program while in the process of completing this course, but they must complete the course with a grade of C or higher to maintain eligibility status. Also, note that this grade will not be counted in the application score.
- Pre-Calculus, MAT1610 (formerly- MAT*186) completed with a grade of C or higher within 5 years of application deadline (February 1, 2025 which means Pre-Calculus taken **before** fall 2019 is not accepted).
- Participate in an interview.
- Attendance at one Gateway Campus Radiation Therapy program information session within 12 months of application deadline (February 1, 2025). <a href="https://gatewayct.edu/academics/aca

Please Note: Radiation Therapy Admission GPA of 2.7 or greater based only on the college courses with grades of C or greater that meet the Radiation Therapy admission requirements (English Composition, A&P I, A&P II, Precalculus) and Radiation Therapy program curriculum requirements (Public Speaking or Interpersonal Communications, General Psychology, General Bio, English Comp II & Literature

Please Note: Official transcripts from other institutions must be sent electronically to the Admissions Office for transfer credit evaluation

This is a full-time, program with a clinical component as assigned.

- Clinical rotations are scheduled from 8a-5p. If the hours at a clinical site are different than the regular scheduled hours, students will follow the schedule of the clinical site they are assigned.

- Students are required to rotate through all clinical sites as assigned and students are required to receive all vaccinations that the clinical sites require
